**Copycat:** Someone who imitates or copies others.

**A Barrel of Laughs:** A funny person.

**Laid-Back:** A person who behaves in a calm and relaxed manner, as if nothing ever bothers them.

**Chatterbox:** Someone who talks a lot or is talkative.

**Jack of All Trades:** A person who is skilled at fixing things and can perform various types of jobs.

**Crybaby:** Someone who cries or complains a lot for no good reason.

**Whizz Kid:** A young person who is very intelligent or successful.
