## People idioms



Copycat: Someone who imitates or copies others.

A Barrel of Laughs: A funny person.

Daredevil: A person who enjoys doing dangerous things and is reckless or daring.

**Armchair Critic**: Someone who makes criticisms about subjects they know little about.

Backseat Driver: A passenger who gives usually unwanted driving advice.

Couch Potato: A lazy, inactive person.

Worrywart: Someone who tends to worry about unimportant things.

Cheapskate: A person who is stingy or tight with money.

Go-Getter: Someone who is ambitious and eagerly pursues their desires.

**Busybody**: A nosy, meddling person who is always interested in what others say and do.

**Laid-Back**: A person who behaves in a calm and relaxed manner, as if nothing ever bothers them.

Chatterbox: Someone who talks a lot or is talkative.

Jack of All Trades: A person who is skilled at fixing things and can perform various types of jobs.

**Crybaby**: Someone who cries or complains a lot for no good reason.

Whizz Kid: A young person who is very intelligent or successful.
